## REFLECTION

## Acts 1:15-17, 21 to the end. 1John 5:9-13. John 17: 6-19

The recounting of the Ascension is one of my favourite passages, in any of the Gospels. It is also (for once) a great opportunity to be up and about at 5.30am to join the congregation at Studland for an early morning Eucharist...and breakfast!

Today we have a "rest break" before another truly inspiring event, Pentecost and the gift of the Holy Spirit. It does give us the opportunity to reflect upon the work of Christian Aid, which should of course be close to our hearts whatever the liturgical season.

We find ourselves listening to the words of Christ at his first farewell to his disciples, at his soon to be experienced arrest. In many respects this has resonances with his Ascension Day prayer. It is a kind of "account giving". He is praying to God for his disciples and it leads me to reflect with thanks on our intercessors today as they lead prayer on our behalf. What would we like them to pray for (if we really told the truth?) Does, then, Jesus' prayer match up to your expectations in any way?

At the heart of it is Jesus' love for his disciples, and the assurance of God's love and his gift for them to be Jesus' companions and witnesses. He prays for their protection for they will surely need it in the future. He acknowledges that the message he left with them causes them to be set aside from "the world" and thus in great danger. In our reading Jesus asks his Father to sanctify them. Another word we might use is dedicate. As Jesus dedicated his being to his Father he prays that they too should be similarly dedicated.

The disciples were sometimes muddled and mistaken, as are we. Nevertheless we are are God's Holy people in God's needy world, and we pray that we too may be dedicated to his world and its needs.

A prayer from Christian Aid week resources:

Dear Lord, you call on us to build your kingdom of justice, mercy, and truth.

It isn't a task for the faint-hearted.

When we lose our sense of purpose, fill us with faith. When we doubt or throw up our hands in despair, fill us with hope.

When we pass by our neighbour as though we did not know them.

Fill us with the love that turns us back and takes us to their aid.

In Jesus 'name, Amen.
