REFLECTION

Luke 4:1-13

I love an alliteration – maybe because it is the foundation of a particular method of Welsh poetry called *Cynghanedd;* (you can learn something new every day). I have 2 alliterations to share as we reflect on the temptations of Jesus.

The first thing we learn is that **Temptations are Tailor-made.** You may not be tempted by the same things as me, and I may not be tempted by those things which tempt you. Jesus was tempted, very specifically, to betray his calling as the Suffering Servant Son of God. Who else would be tempted to demonstrate their position by jumping off the pinnacle of the Temple? Yes, he could have done it, and yes, God's angels would have protected him. It was a temptation tailor-made for God's Son, to wreck his mission and trash God's plan of salvation. Similarly, the offer of all the kingdoms of the world, at the price of worshipping the devil, must have seemed very attractive; take a short-cut, avoid all that stuff about a cross.... Another Tailor-made temptation!

The second thing we learn is how to deal with Tailor-made Temptations. **The Solution is Scriptural.** Jesus' answers to the devil were all quotations from Old Testament scripture. Knowing scripture enabled him to recognise the devil's temptations, and gave him the means to avoid them – even when the devil himself tried to misuse Scripture in his third temptation.

Lent is a good time to get into good habits of reading and reflecting on God's Word. The world is full of **Tailor-made Temptations**, together with false beliefs, and all sorts of things which can lead us astray from God's ways. God's Word gives us his **Scriptural Solutions** to enable us to grow in faith and love for Jesus, and to recognise and resist the devil's lies.
