## REFLECTION

## Acts 9. 36-end; Psalm 23; Revelation 7. 9-end; John 10. 22-30

The image of God as Shepherd features in three of the four readings set for today. It is a powerful image of God. In Psalm 23, reputed to have been written by King David himself, the whole psalm celebrates God as shepherd, present as guide and protector throughout all the good and bad that we go through in life. The psalm writer illustrates God as active in different ways – leading, restoring, guiding, nurturing, anointing and protecting – and gives us a clear picture of loving, caring, and generous God. At the end of the psalm, the writer expresses the clear belief that the God who guided and protected him through life, will bring him home to dwell in God's house forever. Heaven he declares is his destiny.

In today's reading from the book of Revelation, we get a glimpse of Heaven. John describes in his awesome vision the worship of the Lamb by a countless multitude 'from every nation, tribe, people and language.' The Lamb is proclaimed as their perpetual Shepherd.

In our Gospel reading we meet Jesus as the Jewish authorities are demanding a straight answer from him: 'If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly.' But he points out that he has already told them. His works witness to who he is. If only they had faith they would recognise this and believe. The fact that they do not recognise his voice, shows they are not his sheep. Jesus had already declared 'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.' He was declaring who he is and hinted at the cost of what being the good shepherd was to be.

In this season of Easter, may we continue to offer heartfelt thanks for all that the Shepherd has and continues to do for us, for the constancy of his goodness and mercy in our lives and that our eternal destiny is secure in him.
